We have had a busy fall here at the Academy, full of exciting new learning programs, faith filled activities and service to our community and world. This week, our middle school students will attend the Catholic Junior High School Rally at St. Mark's Church and participate in collecting items for the Midnight Drive. In October, our students dedicated their Hispanic Heritage Night Project Presentation to disaster relief in Puerto Rico and Mexico. Children and families collected goods and funds in conjunction with Assembly Member Felix Ortiz of District 51. During the event, our student government representatives helped to organize and load supplies for delivery while our 5th and 6th grade students performed their merengue skills, which they had been practicing in their weekly ballroom classes with Ballroom Basix.
