### **Queen of All Saints Catholic Academy November 15, 2017**

This week our students begin their *Hour of Code* home-school program with Tynker. Students in all grades, K-8 have access to their own personalized lessons and accounts where they can create Minecraft mods, make animations, stories or music, explore STEM projects and even code to fly drones! Students who complete each *Hour of Code* module will receive a special certificate. This week, we will have our first site visit with Lab Learners, a comprehensive Pre-K-8th Grade STEM program. At the visit, we will tour the rooms in our academy to determine the best fit for a new lab, which should be installed in January. In the meantime, students have been exploring the world around them through classroom experiments, virtual explorations and field trips. In other good news, the principal met this week with Math coaches through Houghton Mifflin Harcourt and they will be working one-one with our teachers to help them deliver lessons that are rigorous, differentiated and engage higher order thinking. We look forward to developing more hands on-minds on multi-modal lessons for all our students this year and will be tapping into a variety of resources to bring math alive! Finally, in honor of the holiday, this Friday, students will gather together in a school-wide Thanksgiving celebration, where we will share a Thanksgiving meal and raise funds to help support CHIPS, a local Brooklyn shelter for women and children. Here at the academy, we are truly blessed with the spirit of community, service and faith. Together we are developing citizens who not only use their heads, but also their hearts, in the service of Christ
