All Saints Day – Friday, November 1st

This Friday, All Saints Day, we remember all of the men and women who are, for us, shining examples of virtue and discipleship. Their lives of holiness give us all encouragement and hope. Like us, each saint is different with a different story – different personalities, circumstances, experiences and backgrounds. Yet each one has something to teach us about following Christ in our own time and place. We have patron saints and others who may be favorites. All Saints Day is a time to be grateful for this great group of heroic witnesses who are, through Christ, in communion with us as friends and intercessors who spur us on to perseverance and deeper and more faithful discipleship. For these reasons and more, All Saints Day is a Holy Day of Obligation.

Masses at Queen of All Saints will be offered on Friday, November 1st at 7:00 AM and 8:30 AM.

Please make every effort to attend Mass here or at a church near your workplace or school.

Because November 1 is also the First Friday of the month, there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament after the 8:30 Mass with Benediction at about 9:45.

All Souls Day – Saturday, November 2nd

This Saturday is All Souls Day. It is a day to remember and pray for the faithful departed, our beloved family members, friends and parishioners who have died. Through the power of the Resurrection of Christ we believe that love and loving relationships transcend death. Those who have died and entered eternal life know and experience the effects of our prayers especially through the Mass – all expressions of love.
