



Ite Missa Est

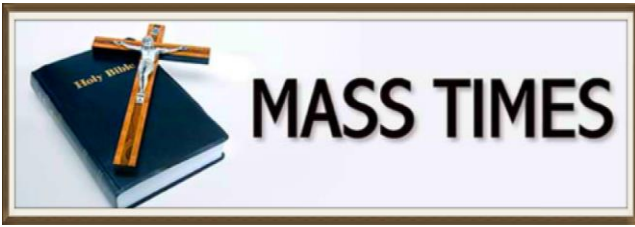
The following is an excerpt from a book of reflections entitled “Balaam’s Donkey” by Trappist Father Michael Casey.

“The dismissal (at Mass) should be like the alarm going off at the fire station. Suddenly all are flung into action. Those present at Mass are being told to go forth and change the world. The presumption is that they themselves have experienced something and have been changed by the liturgy. They are being exhorted to communicate to others what they have received. Pope Leo the Great used more formal language: “Imitate what you celebrate”.

We are sent forth as witnesses. This does not mean that we become soapbox orators. A much subtler mode of witnessing is being willing to engage others in serious conversation. First, we have to establish a mood of solidarity, and then evangelization will eventually find an opening. In our own simple, sympathetic way, we can be an influence for good in the people around us. As Jesus taught, we are to be the salt of the earth. Salt is something that is used only in small quantities, not to impose its own taste but to liberate the natural taste in the food to which it is added. A little is enough. Small acts by small people sometimes have larger-than-life results.

Let us pray: Lord Jesus Christ, you have sent us forth to proclaim the Good News to all people. Deepen our understanding of the message you have brought us, and give us the confidence and courage to communicate what we have received to those who sit in darkness and desolation. For you are our Lord forever and ever. Amen.”
