“How many reputedly good Christians are sad sacks. Their favorite psalm is “Hear my voice, O Lord, as I complain”. Saint Paul exhorts us to be cheerful givers, not mournful receivers. This admonition seems to presuppose our taking control of our life and not allowing the small frustrations and disappointments to undermine our fundamental sense of well-being. We are very foolish if we permit our sense of good cheer to be dependent on external factors. That way we will be up and down all our life, like a perpetual yo-yo.

Cheerfulness is a choice that we make. It can coexist with hard times. It is not merely the result of temperament or a philosophy of life that bids us always look on the bright side. For Christians, cheerfulness comes from faith in the promises of Christ. Despite present reverses, in the end all will be well.

We can go further. The Epistle to the Galatians reminds us that joy is one aspect of the Spirit’s indwelling; there is a joy that surpasses human understanding. So well was this understood that some ancient writers went so far as to believe that sadness was the worst of all sins and the source of many evils.”

“Jesus, joy of our desiring, fill us with confidence that the hundredfold you have promised will be poured into our laps, shaken down and overflowing. Help us to surmount the inevitable difficulties of life with serenity and joy, in the confidence that nothing can separate us from our loving acceptance by God. For you are our Lord forever and ever. Amen”
